Multi Agency Risk Assessment Conferences in Domestic Violence

MARACs are a tool to facilitate discussion and collective decision making. The purpose of MARACs is to bring together representatives from agencies which work with people affected by domestic violence, so that they can share information, make decisions and agree to take actions in order to reduce domestic abuse and protect and support victims and children.

Shadowing Opportunities - Community Safety

I would like to shadow;

- Community Safety Manager**

Leads on the development and implementation of the council's community safety function by working in close partnership with a range of strategic partners and enabling the council to fulfil its statutory duty of reducing crime and disorder in the borough. They are also responsible for the management of the Community Safety Team, ensuring targeted activities to address crime and disorder, anti social behaviour and fear of crime in the borough.
- Community Safety Officer Anti Social Behaviour and Child Protection**

Acts as the central focus for information on the Community Safety Forum's activities to address anti social behaviour and to coordinated related actions and initiatives set out in the Community Safety Strategy and Action Plan. Organises the work of the Problem Solving Core Group and plans, organises and coordinates the communication of information about anti social behaviour initiatives to the community and partner agencies.
- Community Safety Analyst**

Collates and analyses crime and disorder information from a range of partners and to inform the decision making process regarding crime and disorder reduction issues. Post is jointly funded by the council and the police.
- Community Safety Coordinator (Police Secondee)**

Supports the Community Safety Partnership in preventing and tackling both crime and anti social behaviour and is responsible for supporting new and existing Neighbourhood Watch schemes in the borough. Leads on Crime Reduction Environment Work (CREW) and the Community Safety Grant scheme.
- Business Crime Reduction Manager**

Manages Business Crime Reduction Partnership and the promotion of best practice as identified by the Action Against Business Crime Initiative in order to reduce crime and anti social behaviour within the business community. Post is funded by Hampshire Constabulary, the council, the town's shopping centres, and a number of private businesses.
- Community Safety Officer - Anti Social Behaviour Caseworker** -

Undertakes anti social behaviour case assessments, works with witnesses, perpetrators and a range of agencies in arranging and monitoring the ABC process, developing support packages and monitoring the progress of anti social behaviour cases. Is also responsible for maintaining accurate records and preparing evidence and reports for legal action and court cases on anti social behaviour.
- Area Manager - Prolific and Priority Offenders Scheme** (PPO)

Four Hampshire Community Safety Forums have pooled their resources in order to help them to deliver the Prolific and Other Priority Strategy. Manages a co-located multi-agency team of specialist officers (Police, Probation and Local Authority). Is responsible for the day to day management of the team, provides a strategic lead and representation at a regional level.
- Prolific and other Priority Offenders Client Services Coordinator** (PPO)

Works within the PPO strategy and assesses each PPO. Puts in place interventions and programmes designed to interrupt the cycle of re-offending. Monitors the progress of the PPO and provides a forum for multi agency work to occur ensuring the PPO is able to return to "mainstream" society dealing with areas such as drugs services, housing, social services and family services, continuing education and jobs training, behaviour modification, budgeting and parenting skills.
- Domestic Violence Coordinator**

Leads on developing and coordinating effective domestic violence inter-agency working in the borough, seeking to reduce the incidents of domestic violence homelessness caused as a result of domestic violence. Ensures the council is compliant with Best Value Performance Indicator (BVPI) 176. Fixed term contract funded by the Government Office of the South East

Community Wardens

Specially trained and uniformed Community Wardens who provide a visible presence in designated residential areas. Work closely with communities and partners to improve the well-being of local residents and make their neighbourhoods cleaner and safer. Assist with environmental improvements and contribute to community development.

Shadowing Opportunities - Community Development

Community Health Development Officer

Working closely with the Community Safety Team this role is responsible for addressing local health inequalities and actively engaging with local health service providers. The postholder chairs the Drug Action Review Group and works closely with schools and colleges promoting educational awareness on health related issues.

Community Development Officer (Black & Minority Ethnic Groups)

Ensures contact with individuals, groups, organisations and communities from ethnic minorities in the borough is established and maintained. Provides support and understanding to BME communities and works closely with the Community Safety Team and the Police to provide support in assisting the victims of race related anti social behaviour.
