Although not specifically within the priorities identified within this Strategic Assessment the subsequent Partnership Plan should ensure that sufficient emphasis is placed on the Prolific and Other Priority Offenders Programme (PPO) and the Drug Intervention Programme (DIP) as effective tools in reducing crime and re-offending rates.

The new National Community Safety Plan 2008-11, together with the recently refreshed Crime Strategy (Cutting Crime: A New Partnership 2008-11) provides strategic and tactical guidance to a number of agencies and, in particular, is aimed at Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnerships to enable them to achieve their Public Service Agreement (PSA) targets, in particular PSA23:

Priority Action 1: Reduce the most serious violence
Priority Action 2: Continue to make progress on serious acquisitive crime
Priority Action 4: Reduce re-offending

It can be said, therefore, that the PPO Programme and the DIP Programme are the bedrocks upon which CDRP's are encouraged to build their crime reduction strategies:

'At its heart, the Crime Strategy sets out a strategic framework for tackling crime and increasing community safety through early intervention; prevention; reducing re-offending; and tackling key drivers of crime (alcohol and drug misuse, and social exclusion). The Prolific and Other Priority Offenders Programme and the Drug Intervention Programme, in particular, are two of the most powerful approaches that local partners have available to impact on tackling crime and increasing community safety.' (National Community Safety Plan 2008-11, page 6)
