

## **Comparison of Homes built in the North East of Basingstoke to South West of Basingstoke**

At the Inspector's Hearings for the Basingstoke Local Plan there was a great deal of emphasis on the location of homes proposed in the plan. Many are claiming that there is an imbalance, in that more homes are proposed in the South West than the North East. These claims have been made without reference to the historical evidence of the numbers built in recent years. The following figures, for dwellings, are based on census data provided by the Council for the wards as they existed in 1991 and 2014 (comparable geography to 2011).

They show that there has been far more dwellings built in the North East of the Borough than the South West.

Adjustments for losses and gains to Hatch Warren & Beggarwood due to changes in the Urban Rural boundary with North Waltham are broadly neutral.
