

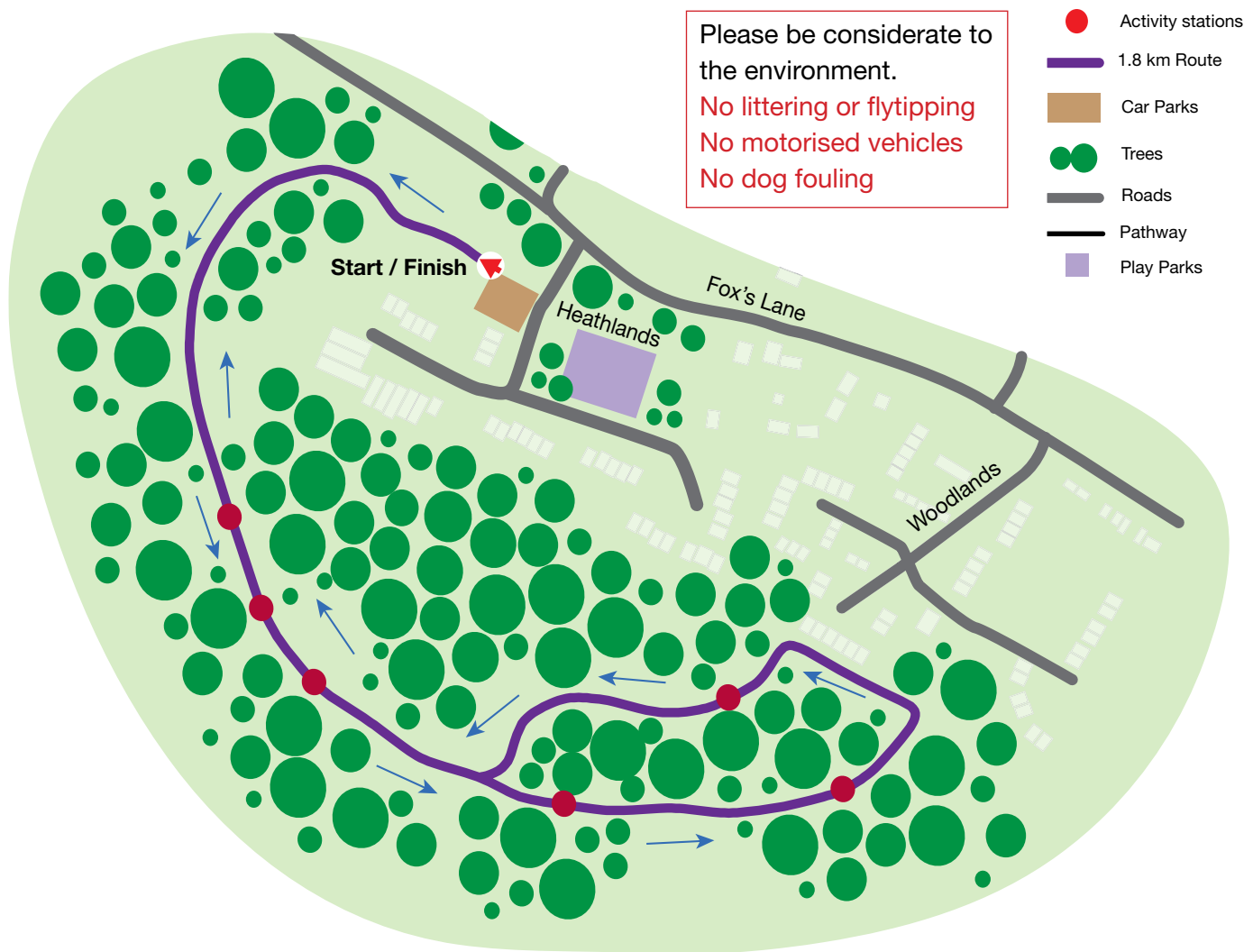
Little Penwood Trim Trail

Little Penwood is an ancient woodland, which developed naturally but has been modified by management over the centuries. There is a diverse range of trees including veteran oaks, yew and holly covering an area of approximately 13 hectares.

The woodland would once have been used to provide fuel and timber products, but is now also managed to promote wildlife and recreation. The site has been designated as a Site of Importance for Nature Conservation by Hampshire County Council.

This waymarked route can be used for training, making use of the activity stations or you can simply follow the markers for a leisurely woodland walk.

It is suitable for beginners and athletes alike and is a fun way to maintain or improve your fitness levels. The trail is a great way for all to enjoy the natural environment.



Use of this waymarked route and activity stations is done at your own risk, so please be mindful of current weather conditions, the terrain underfoot and of falling deadwood on windy days.
