Who are we?

We are a small group of local residents who seek to conserve and maintain this route for future generations.

About Fuzzy Drove

Fuzzy Drove is an ancient bridle path that runs from Oakley to Kempshott Lane. It is populated by stretches of hedgerow species, interspersed with mature Oak, Ash, Holly, Elder and other trees.

Over time wildlife diversity has declined along the bridleway, in particular wild flowers that have been over shaded by bramble, however it's still a beautiful walk at any time of year.

What do we do?

We are working towards restoring the wildlife habitat by controlling dominant species and replanting to encourage insects and small mammals to repopulate the Drove. We also do tree and wildlife surveys, and general maintenance work such as light coppicing and restoring elements of the hedgerow.
