## Who are we?

We are a small, friendly group of Oakley volunteers who wish to plant native trees, protect woods, trees and their wildlife for the future and inspire everyone to enjoy and value woods, trees, hedgerows and wildflowers.

## Where do we operate?

We work in the parish of Oakley and Deane. Since 2011 a large part of our work has been on the Oakley to Kempshott multi-user pathway, where the surrounding habitats promote a wealth of wildlife and form a 'green corridor' between Oakley and Basingstoke. We also undertake projects for Oakley and Deane Parish Council to enhance village parks and play areas.



## What do we do?

We co-operate with the North Hampshire Countryside Access Team who maintain the pathway. We spend time helping to maintain the wildlife hedgerow, trees and wildflowers we have planted in order to increase the overall biodiversity. This includes pruning and coppicing when volunteers are provided with hand tools and protective equipment.

We have also installed a range of seats along this accessible pathway, popular with walkers, cyclists and children.

Recent projects for the parish council have been to plant and maintain a Jubilee hedgerow in Upper Farm Road play area, a beech and a mixed hedgerow in Beach Park and tree whips in Avon Road play area.
