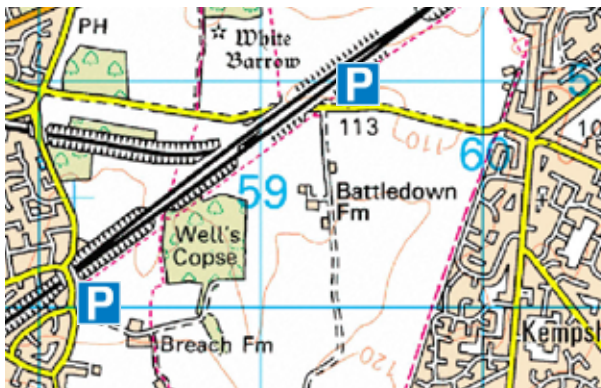
About the O-K multi-user pathway

Our area of operation is the parish of Oakley. We are currently focusing our activities on the Oakley to Kempshott multi-user pathway, where the surrounding habitats promote a wealth of wildlife and form a 'green corridor' between Oakley and Basingstoke.

What do we do?

We co-operate with the North Hampshire Countryside Access Team who maintain the pathway. We spend time helping to maintain the pathway and the trees and the wildlife hedgerow we have planted. We also manage the adjacent woodland and undertake wildflower bulb planting to increase the overall biodiversity.
