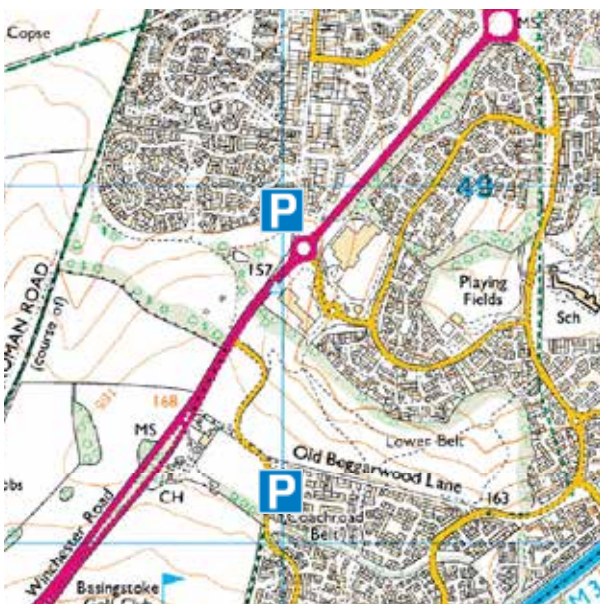
About Old Down and Beggarwood

Old Down wildflower meadows provide a rich nectar source for insects. It has over 28 species of butterfly and is regarded by Butterfly Conservation as Hampshire's stronghold for the rare small blue butterfly. Beggarwood is the sister site to Old Down. It's more sheltered and contains several different woodland copses. The mature woodlands on both sites are classified as Sites of Importance for Nature Conservation (SINC) as is the chalk grassland on Old Down. Both sites attract a wide variety of birds. We also hold occasional walks, talks and moth evenings.

What do we do?

We meet throughout the year to undertake conservation tasks on both sites, from glade management, surveying and monitoring, to woodland management, coppicing and dead hedging.
