



**REGISTRATION OF MEMBERS' PECUNIARY INTERESTS**

Localism Act 2011- sections 29 and 30.

GIVE NOTICE that I have the following pecuniary interests which are specified for the purposes of section 30(3) of the Localism Act 2011 (please state 'none' where appropriate). In the interest of openness, I also declare the following personal interests listed under item 8 of this form.

**1. Employment, business, profession or vocation**

Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain.

***Why do I have to provide this information?***

There is a legal requirement for Councillors to provide this information within 28 days of their election/co-option. There is also a legal requirement to keep this information up to date of any changes throughout their term of office. Again, the purpose is transparency, and helps to avoid potential conflicts of interest.

***What is required?***

This means your job, or if you are self-employed, the nature of that business. Please be specific. Avoid terms such as Finance or Public Sector, as that is too broad. State the role, Accountant or Social Worker for example. Please also provide the company name.

**Spouse, civil partner, partner living with as spouse or civil partner**

***Why do I have to provide information for my partner, spouse or civil partner?***

Again, for the same reasons as above, transparency. It is also a legal requirement under the Localism Act 2011.

## 2. Sponsorship

Any payment or other financial benefit (other than from the relevant authority), made within the period of your office as an elected, co-opted or appointed member, in respect of any expenses or election expenses incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member.

This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

### **What is required?**

If applicable, please include details of people who sponsored your election campaign expenditure. It may be that this was simply the political party whom you represent. You may wish to discuss this with your election agent.

## 3. Contracts

Any contract which is made between you, or your spouse/partner (or a body in which you have a beneficial interest), and the relevant authority of which you are a member:-

- a) under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and
- b) which has not been fully discharged.

### **Member**

#### **What is required?**

This applies where you, a firm in which you are a partner, a company of which you are a paid director or a company in which you own shares enters into contract with the Parish Council. If you work as a consultant and carry out work for the Parish Council, you should include details here, rather than in section 1.

### **Spouse, civil partner, partner living with as spouse or civil partner**

#### 4. Land in the area of the authority

Any beneficial interest in land which is within the area of the authority (as owner, lessee, tenant etc.). You should also include any property from which you pay or receive rent, or of which you are the mortgagee.

<b>Member</b>
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<b><i>What is required?</i></b>
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This applies to premises you own or rent in your parish/ward including business premises. It will include your home in almost all cases unless you are living somewhere such as a hostel or have taken a holiday let, in which case you should complete Section 5 instead. You should also disclose any land owned

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#### 5. Licences to occupy land

Any licence (alone or jointly with others) to occupy land in the area of the relevant authority for a month or longer.

<b>Member</b>
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<b><i>What is required?</i></b>
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This applies to short-term lets where you only have a licence as opposed to a tenancy. It could include things such as allotments and garages. It will also apply if you temporarily change address and are living with another person for a period of 28 days or more.
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<b>Spouse, civil partner, partner living with as spouse or civil partner</b>
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## 6. Corporate Tenancies

Any tenancy where, to your knowledge:-

- a) the landlord is the relevant authority; and
- b) the tenant is a body in which the relevant authority has a beneficial interest.

<b>Member</b>
<b><i>What is required?</i></b>
This applies to any tenancy where to your knowledge:-
(a) the landlord is the Parish Council; and
(b) the tenant is a firm in which you are a partner or body corporate of which you are a director, or in the securities of which you have a beneficial interest.

<b>Spouse, civil partner, partner living with as spouse or civil partner</b>
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## 7. Securities

Any beneficial interest in securities of a body where:-

- a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of the relevant authority; and
- b) either;-
  - (i) the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or
  - (ii) if the share capital of that body is more than one class, the total nominal value of the share of any one class in which the relevant person has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issues share capital of that class.

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**Spouse, civil partner, partner living with as spouse or civil partner**

**8. Membership of other bodies**

List any membership of, or position of general control or management in any:-

- a) body to which you have been appointed or nominated by the authority as its representative;
- b) public authority or body exercising functions of a public nature;
- c) body directed to charitable purposes;
- d) body, one of whose principal purposes include the influence of public opinion or policy (including any political party or trade union).

**Member**

Please include details of bodies where you are a Parish Council nominated representative as well as those where you are member in your own right. The bodies should be authorities in their own right and might include Hospital Trusts or the governing bodies of schools or colleges.

You should also include membership of bodies such as the National Trust, the Grand charity etc.

This section also includes freemasons in addition to political parties, trade unions and lobbying group.

## Notes

- (i) Upon election or co-option, a Member must register their pecuniary and other registerable interests (including that of their spouse or partner) with the Council's Monitoring Officer **within 28 days** of their election/co-option.
- (ii) 'Relevant authority' refers to the body to which you have become an elected, co-opted or appointed member.
- (iii) Please check your entries in the register regularly to ensure they are up to date. It is your responsibility to report any change in circumstance and to make sure that details reported to the Monitoring Officer are up to date and correct,
- (iv) It will be a breach of the Council's Code of Conduct to omit information, provide information that is materially false or fail to keep the information up to date.
