Notice is hereby given that The Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with Hampshire County Council in exercise of its powers under sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35, 45, 46, 122 (1) and (2), 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (the Act of 1984) as amended and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, has made the following Order subject to minor modifications to the Order as previously advertised:

**Title:-**

The title of the Order will be Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Loading and Unloading and Parking Places (Consolidation) Order 2018) (Amendment No. 8)(Marnel Park, Basingstoke) Order 2019.

**The effect of the Order will be:-**

To introduce the following parking controls:

No waiting at any time on certain lengths of road as further detailed in the plans specified in Schedule 2 of the Order. Roads affected include Appleton Drive and Barrington Drive and the junctions of these roads with Carter Drive, Benham Road, Englefield Way, Gardiner Road, Merryweather Way and Ilsley Road (Plans AZ44, BA43 and BA44).

**Date of operation:-**

This Order will come into operation on 29 August 2020.

**Application to the High Court:-**

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provisions contained in the Order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of Sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35, 45, 46 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of those Sections or of Parts I, II, III or IV of Schedule 9 to the Act or any requirements made under the said Part III of Schedule 9 have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, by 10 October 2020 make application for the purpose to the High Court.
