Apologies but the comment on page 49 of the Consultation Statement is a little misleading. The Hampshire Environmental Records were indeed accessed by AECOM but as they show no areas of archaeological interest on any of the sites, consequently there is no map. The Hampshire Historic Environment Record can be accessed

at: <https://www.hants.gov.uk/landplanningandenvironment/environment/historicenvironment>

There is a map on page 42 of the Conservation Area Appraisal which shows the areas of high archaeological potential which I've reproduced here. This shows that there are no archaeological features on any of the sites assessed. I can place this on the web site. AECOM submitted a site by site assessment to clarify this point but as this was received after the close of the consultation it was not forwarded to yourself.
