

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Profile



Population

The 2011 Census population of Basingstoke and Deane was 167,800 people. The population had increased by 15,225 people since 2001, approximately 10.0%. Compared to 7.9% for the South East.

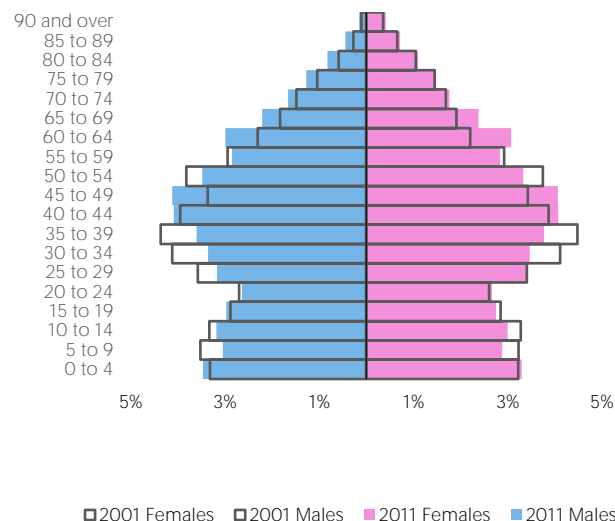

In addition to the usually resident population, there were 2,845 schoolchildren and students that lived outside the borough during term-time.

Length of Residence

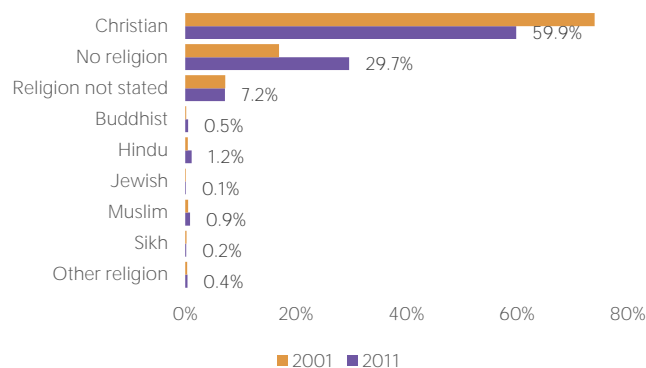
10.7% of the population were born outside the UK. 45.8% of these people had lived in the UK for 10 or more years.

Age and Gender Profile



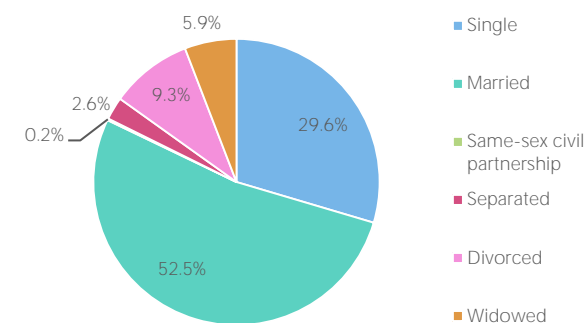
The population had aged since 2001. The percentage of the population aged 45 and over increased by 10.7%, whilst the population aged under 45 declined by 6.3%.

Religion



The majority of residents were Christian (59.9%) but this figure had declined by 19.1% since 2001. 29.7% had no religion, which was an increase of 74.7% since 2001.

Marital and Civil Partnership Status



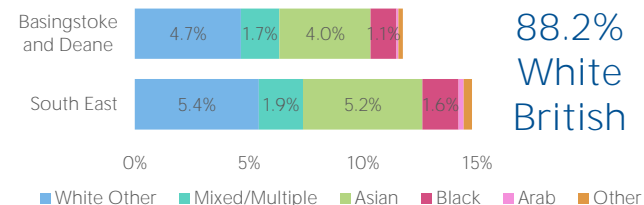
The percentage of the adult population that were married declined by 5.2% over the decade. Compared to a 7.0% decline for the South East. The percentage that were widowed declined by 10.6%.

 **Polish and Nepalese** were the other most common main languages

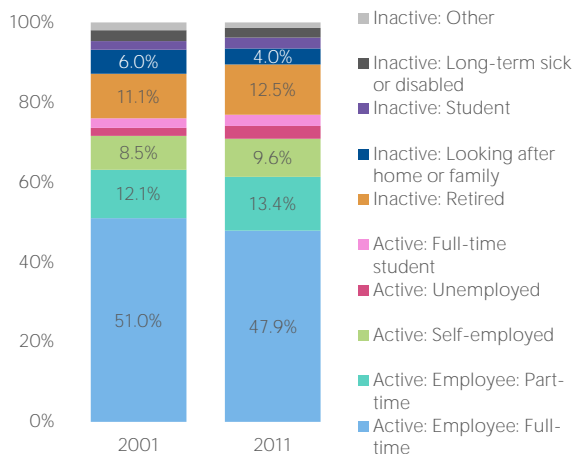
Ethnic Group

Non-White British ethnicities made up 11.8% of the borough's population (shown on the chart).

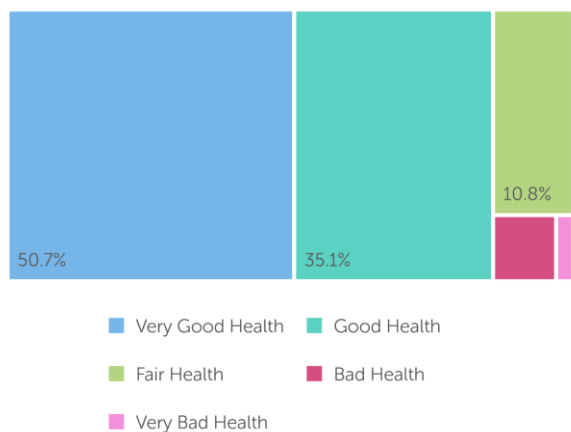


Economic Activity



Almost half (47.9%) of all residents aged 16-74 were working full-time in 2011, a decline of 6.0% since 2001. Those that were retired accounted for 12.5%, an increase of 12.7% since 2001. The percentage that were self-employed increased by 12.3%.

General Health



50.7% of the population were in very good health and a further 35.1% were in good health. Of those with bad or very bad health (3.5%), 44.5% were aged 65 and over.

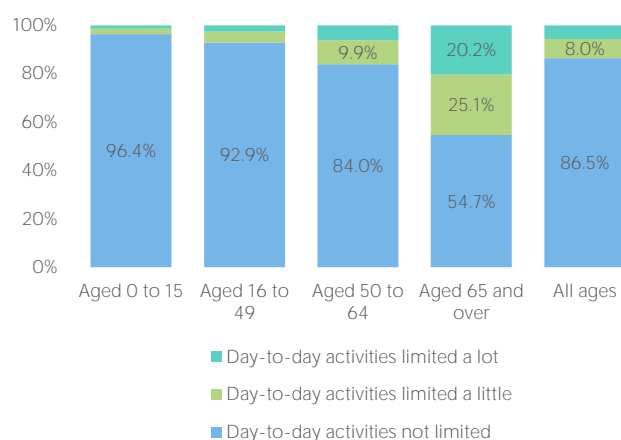
Occupation

Top five occupations:

1. Administrative occupations (9.3%)
2. Corporate managers and directors (8.6%)
3. Elementary administration and service occupations (8.6%)
4. Business and public service associate professionals (8.5%)
5. Science research, engineering and technology professionals (8.3%)

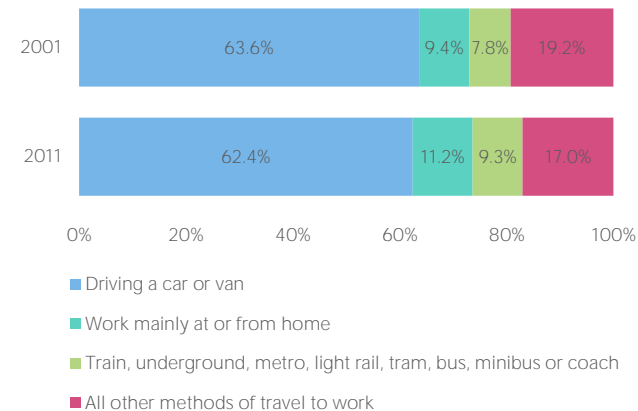
These top five occupations accounted for 43.4% of all the occupations in the borough. Since 2001, the percentage of the population employed in professional occupations (shown in blue) increased by 57.7%, whilst the percentage employed as managers, directors and senior officials (shown in purple) declined by 33.5%.

Long-Term Health Problem or Disability



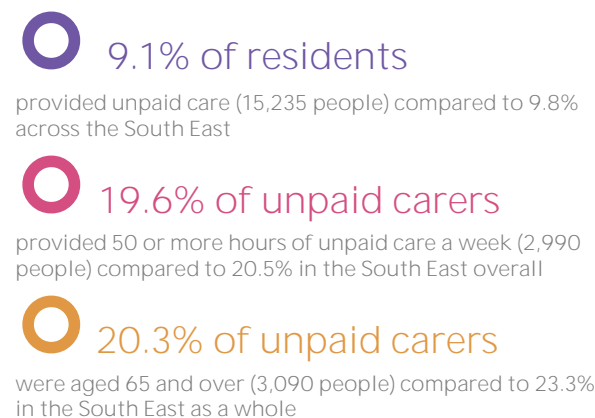
The percentage with a health problem or disability increased with age. 45.3% of those aged 65 and over had their day to day activities limited, compared to 48.0% across the South East.

Method of Travel to Work



The majority (62.4%) of those aged 16-74 in employment drove a car to work. The percentage travelling by car declined by 1.9% since 2001. The percentage travelling by public transport increased (+20.4%), along with home working (+19.6%).

Provision of Unpaid Care



Qualifications

17.3% of those age 16 and over had no qualifications.



Dwellings

The number of dwellings in Basingstoke and Deane in 2011 was 70,935. This was an increase of 8,175 dwellings since 2001, approximately 13.0%. Compared to 8.9% for the South East and 8.3% for England.



In addition to dwellings, there were 100 communal establishments in the borough. These contained 1,330 people.

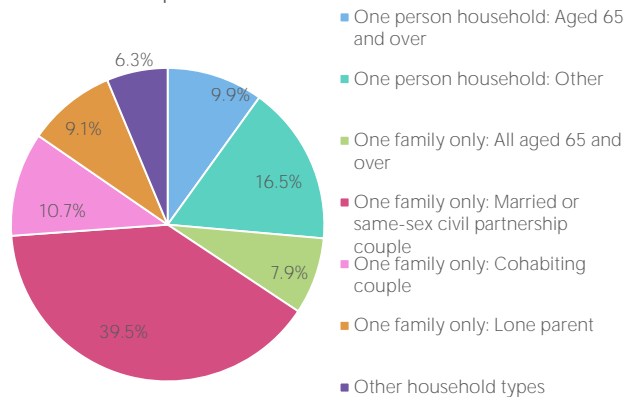

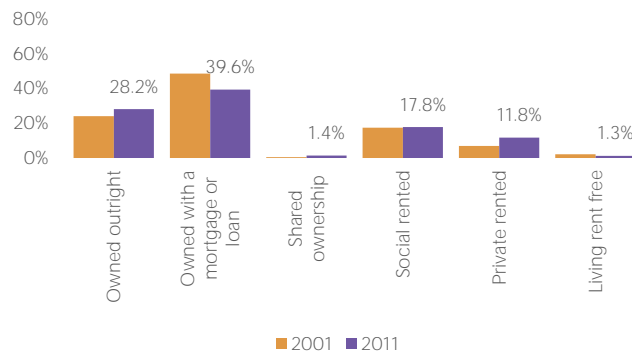
Over the decade, average household size declined from 2.45 to 2.40. Average household size was above the South East (2.38) and England (2.36) average. The average home in Basingstoke and Deane had 5.8 rooms and 2.9 bedrooms, similar to the South East average (5.6 and 2.8).

Household Composition



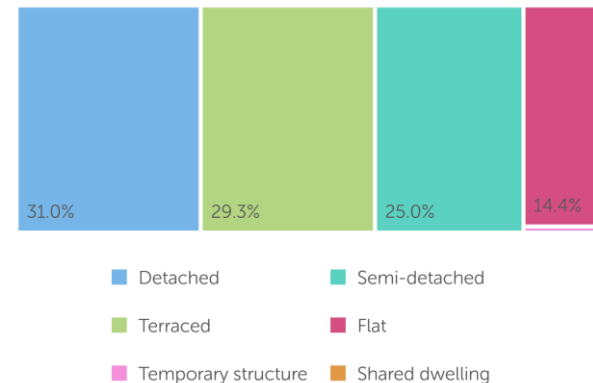
There were 69,315 households in Basingstoke and Deane and these housed 166,470 people. Many households were occupied by married or same-sex civil partnership couple households (39.5%). Over a quarter (26.4%) of households were lived in by those that live alone, an increase of 4.1% since 2001. 18.0% of households were occupied entirely by those aged 65 and over.

Household Tenure



Over the decade, the percentage of households that owned their home with a mortgage declined by 18.8%. Outright ownership increased by 16.3%, whilst private renting grew by 70.7%. Shared ownership increased by 152.4%, which was an increase of 620 households.

Accommodation Type



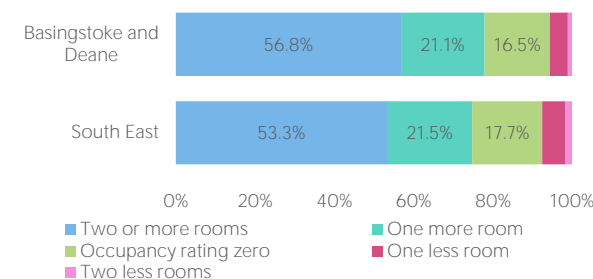
Many households lived in detached properties (31.0%). The percentage living in flats increased by 26.7% over the decade. The percentage living in houses and bungalows declined by 2.9%.

Car Availability

15.2% of households had no access to a car or van, compared to 18.6% for the South East as a whole. 3.0% had access to four or more cars or vans. There were 100,590 cars or vans.



Occupancy Rating

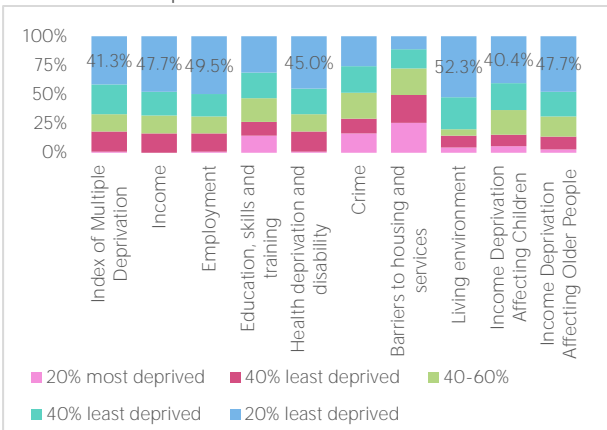


The majority of households had two or more rooms than they needed (56.8%).

Indices of Deprivation, 2019



The chart shows Indices of Deprivation data for each domain and both IDACI and IDAOPI. It records the percentage of Lower Super Output Areas (LSOA) in each decile, compared to all LSOAs nationally. For many of the domains, many of the borough's LSOAs are in the 20% least deprived. The borough is more deprived under barriers to housing and services; crime; and education, skills and training domains.

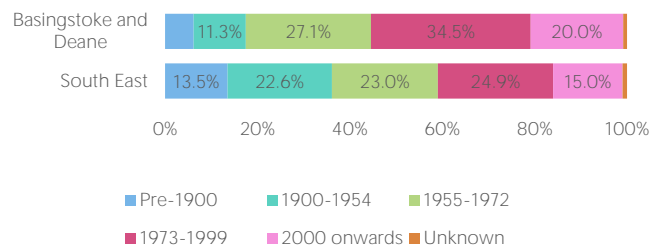

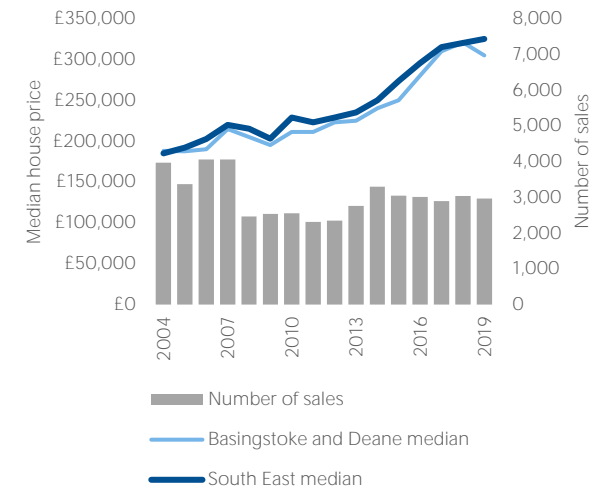


Council tax property build period, 2020



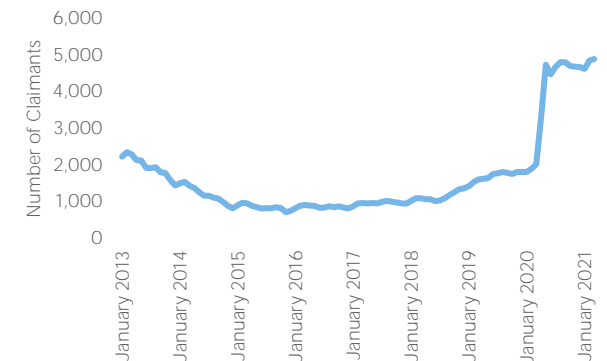
Basingstoke and Deane had a larger percentage of dwellings built in the later part of the 20th Century compared to the South East as a whole, with 54.6% built from 1973 onwards, compared to 39.9% for the region overall.

House prices and sales, 2004-2019



There were 2,965 home sales in 2019, similar to recent years. This was 2.2% of the region's house sales. Basingstoke and Deane had a median house price in 2019 of £375,000, compared to the region median of £325,000, and prices in the borough are consistently in line with the region average.

Unemployed Benefit Claimant Count, 2013 to 2021

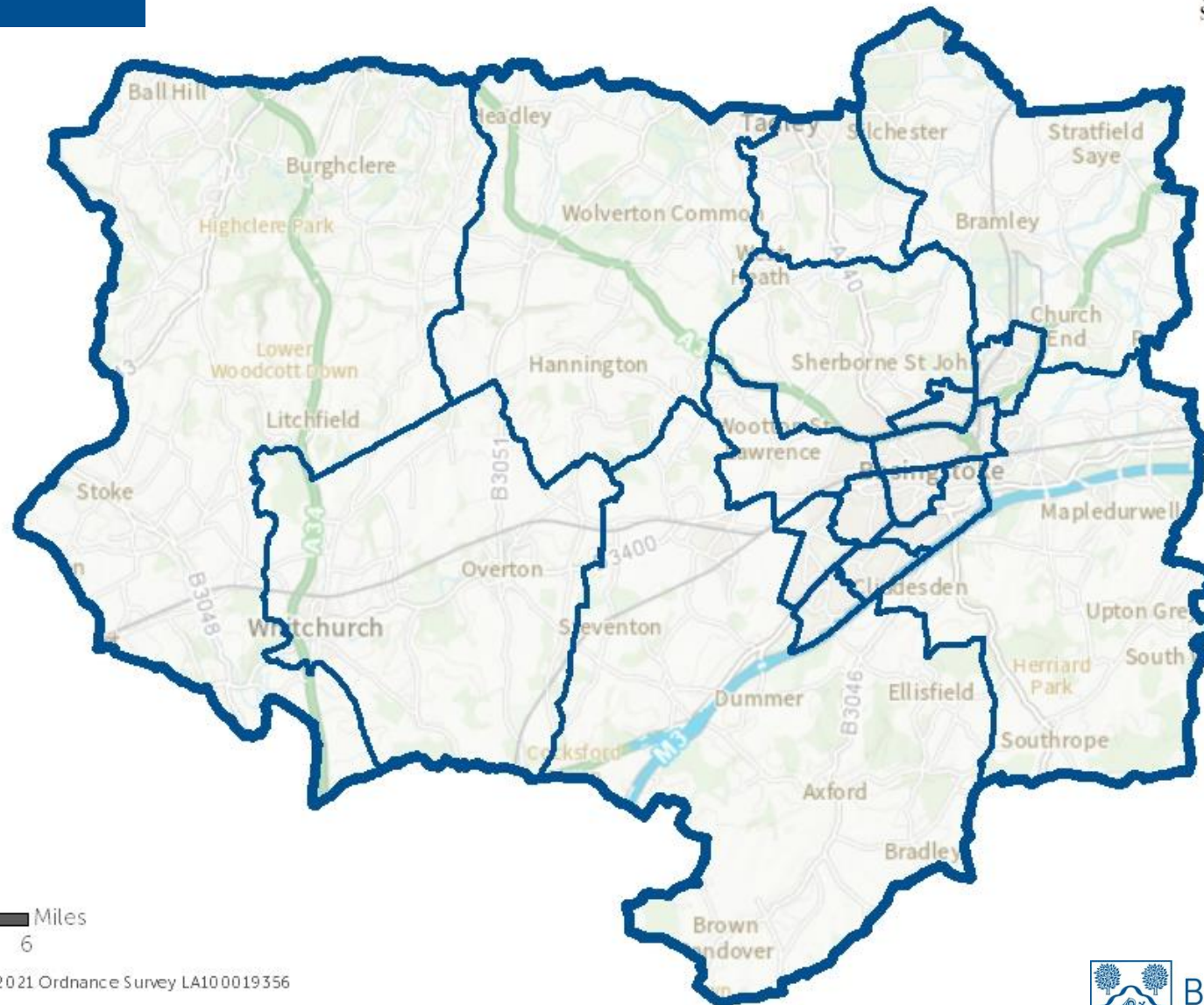


The number of unemployed benefit claimants peaked in March 2021.
