

**BASINGSTOKE AND DEANE (OFF STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2019 (AMENDMENT NO 6)
(ANCHOR YARD CAR PARK, KINGSCLERE, BELL STREET CAR PARK, WHITCHURCH, JIBBS
MEADOW CAR PARK, BRAMLEY, POPLEY FIELDS COMMUNITY CENTRE CAR PARK AND
ROOKSDOWN COMMUNITY CENTRE CAR PARK) ORDER 2023**

Notice is hereby given that The Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with Hampshire County Council in exercise of its powers under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4, 5, 32, 35 and 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (the Act of 1984) as amended and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 has made the following Order:

Title:-

The title of the Order is the Basingstoke and Deane (Off Street Parking Places) Order 2019 (Amendment No 6) (Anchor Yard Car Park, Kingsclere, Bell Street Car Park, Whitchurch, Jibbs Meadow Car Park, Bramley, Popley Fields Community Centre Car Park and Rooksdown Community Centre Car Park) Order 2023.

The effect of the Order will be:-

1. The addition of the following car parks to the off-street parking Order, which will enable disabled parking and electric vehicle parking bays to be enforced by the Council:

- Anchor Yard Car Park, Kingsclere (Drawing No. 30)
- Jibbs Meadow Car Park, Bramley (Drawing No.31)
- Popley Fields Community Centre Car Park (Drawing No.32)
- Rooksdown Community Centre Car Park (Drawing No.33)

It should be noted that parking within these car parks will remain free of charge.

2. To update the plan for Bell Street, Whitchurch (Drawing No.26) within the off-street Order to include the access road to the car park. This will allow enforcement of the existing double yellow lines on the access road and bus/coach layby.

Date of Operation:-

This Order will come into operation on 11 November 2023.

Application to the High Court:-

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provisions contained in the Order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4, 5, 32, 35 and 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of those Sections or of Parts I, II, III or IV of Schedule 9 to the Act or any requirements made under the said Part III of Schedule 9 have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, by 23 December 2023 make application for the purpose to the High Court.
